# Dosage

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- 2.5 to 10 units per band
- Place injections about one inch (~3 cm) apart
- There are variable anterior and lateral bands
- If patients are a good candidate, bands are easy to see
- Know when additional treatments are necessary

# Not an Ideal Candidate

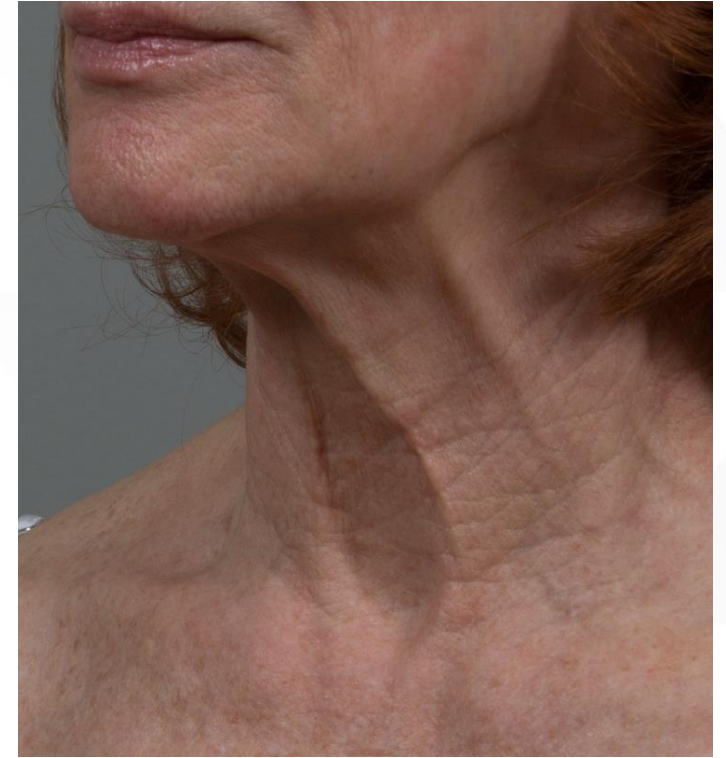
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Patient with neck laxity



Patient with fullness

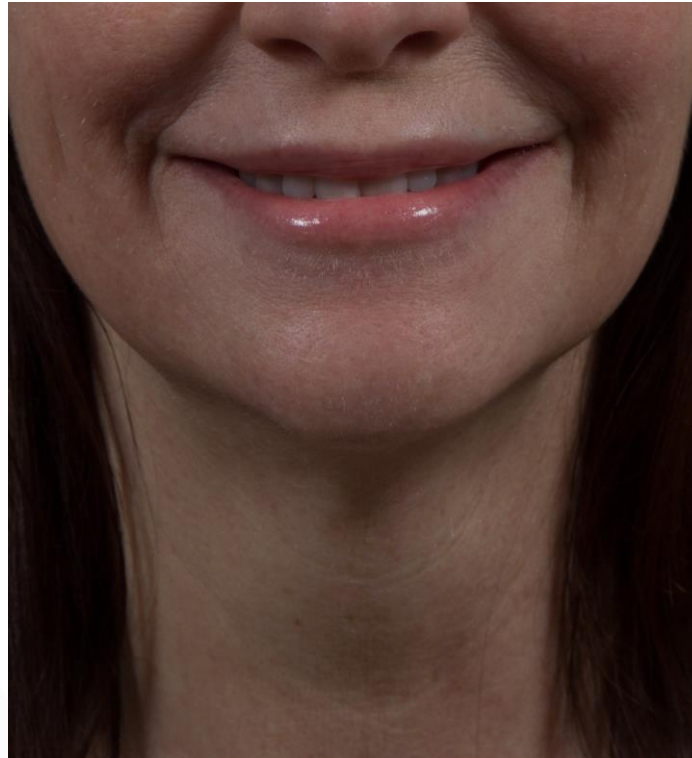


Patient not able to retract back

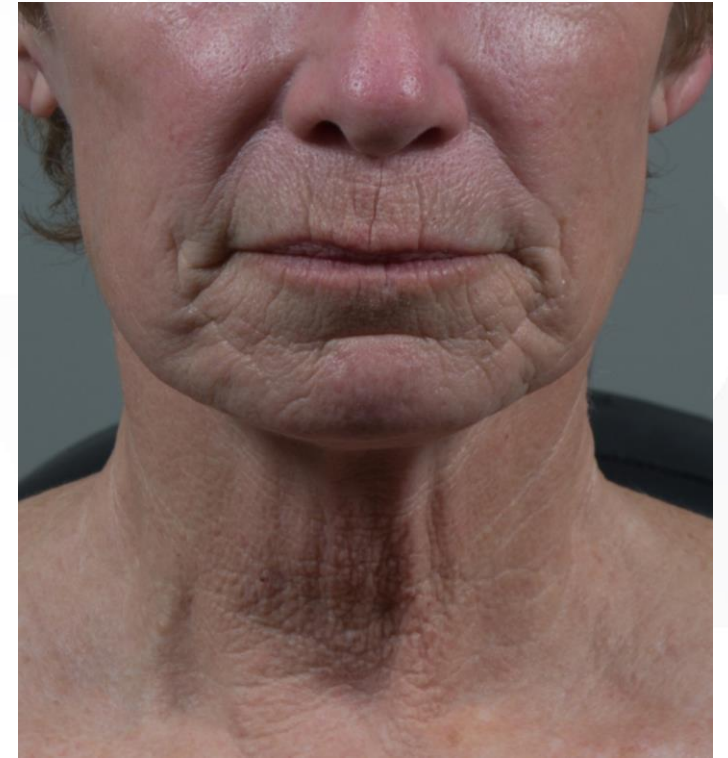


# Prevention vs. Treatment

- Always assess the neck: helps you notice when lines will develop before patient even notices them
- Catch the causes before concerns arise
- Prevent concerns and make patients happy
